RELATIONS WITH SPECIALIZED AGENCIES

Report of the Administrative and Legal Committee

1. The Committee, at its eleventh meeting held on 29 September 1958, considered item 18 of the agenda, concerning relations with specialized agencies. The Committee had before it draft relationship agreements with the International Labour Organisation (GC(II)/46 and Add.1 and Add.1/Corr.1), with the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (GC(II)/47), with the World Health Organization (GC(II)/48), with the World Meteorological Organization (GC(II)/49), and with the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (GC(II)/50 and Corr.1), all of which were submitted by the Board of Governors to the General Conference for its approval under Article XVI of the Statute. A draft resolution (GC(II)/COM.2/16) under which the General Conference would approve the various relationship agreements, was submitted jointly by Australia, Brazil, Sweden, Turkey and the United States of America.
2. The Committee unanimously recommends the joint draft resolution which follows, for adoption by the General Conference. In order to make possible the submission of these agreements to the Board and the General Conference, the texts have had to be prepared under circumstances of great urgency, and certain changes of a purely editorial nature may therefore be desirable. The Committee therefore recommends that the Director General, in agreement with the Directors General of the specialized agencies concerned, be authorized to make such changes.
3. The text of the resolution is as follows:

RELATIONS WITH SPECIALIZED AGENCIES

The General Conference,

Having considered the proposed relationship agreements with certain specialized agencies of the United Nations submitted by the Board of Governors in accordance with the request of the General Conference^{1/},

Approves the relationship agreements with the International Labour Organisation, the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, the World Health Organization, the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, and the World Meteorological Organization^{2/}.
