PROTECTION OF NUCLEAR INSTALLATIONS
DEVOTED TO PEACEFUL PURPOSES AGAINST ARMED ATTACKS

Draft resolution submitted by the Islamic Republic of Iran

CONSEQUENCES OF ARMED ATTACKS AGAINST NUCLEAR INSTALLATIONS DEVOTED TO PEACEFUL PURPOSES.

The General Conference,

- (a) <u>Considering</u> that it is consistent with the statutory provisions for the <u>Agency</u> to promote the development, without obstacles, of the peaceful uses of atomic energy and to take decisions relating thereto,
- (b) <u>Taking into account</u> the consensus among Member States of the Agency that armed attacks against peaceful nuclear installations should not only be discouraged but also explicitly prohibited,
- (c) Recalling resolution GC(XXVII)/RES/407, adopted by the General Conference on 14 October 1983, which, inter alia, expressed that it would further the cause of peace to extend the prohibition of armed attacks so as to protect all nuclear installations devoted to peaceful purposes, and
- (d) <u>Considering</u> the gravity of dangers arising from armed attacks on nuclear installations,
- 1. <u>Declares</u> that an attack by a Member State on a nuclear installation submitted to Agency inspections under the provisions of agreements with the Agency would call for the application of Article XIX of the Statute; and
- 2. Requests the Director General to keep the General Conference informed of any incident in this area.
