Viet Nam	for the Middle East and South Asia; South East Asia and the Pacific; or the Far East

*/ As a result, the composition of the Board of Governors in 1991-92 at the conclusion of the thirty-fifth (1991) regular session of the General Conference was as follows:

Algeria, Argentina, Australia, Austria, Belgium, Brazil, Bulgaria, Cameroon, Canada, China, Cuba, Ecuador, Egypt, France, Germany, Greece, India, Indonesia, the Islamic Republic of Iran, Japan, the Republic of Korea, Mexico, Morocco, Norway, Pakistan, Portugal, Romania, Thailand, Ukraine**/, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics***/, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the United States of America, Uruguay, Viet Nam and Zaire.

**/ The Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic, which was elected by the General Conference in 1990, subsequently changed its name to "Ukraine".

***/ Subsequently, the membership of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics in the IAEA and in all its organs, including the Board, was continued by the "Russian Federation" (see INFCIRC/397).
