## NUCLEAR TECHNOLOGY REVIEW 2002

### Corrigendum

On page 16 of document GC(46)/INF/5, “Nuclear Technology Review”, the paragraph starting “Intergovernmental discussions ...” should be replaced by the following paragraphs:

Intergovernmental discussions have begun for the joint implementation of the ITER Project, including decisions on cost sharing and site selection. Canada has offered a site near the Darlington nuclear power station on Lake Ontario. ITER is anticipated to cost about \$3.5 billion and construction may start as early as 2003 [7].

At an ITER meeting early in June, the European Union and Japan submitted proposals for hosting the ITER Project: the European Union offered two sites – Cadarache in France and Vandellós in Spain; Japan offered a site at Rokkashomura, in Aomori Prefecture. These offers are in addition to an offer made by Canada in June 2001.
