# Examination of Delegates' Credentials

## **Statement of Arab States, members of the International Atomic Energy Agency participating in the sixtieth regular session of the IAEA General Conference (26–30 September 2016) regarding their reservations about the credentials of the Israeli delegation**

The undersigned delegations of the Arab Member States of the International Atomic Energy Agency participating in the work of the 60th session of the IAEA General Conference wish to express their reservation about the credentials of the Israeli delegation for the following reasons:

- (1) Israel has annexed the city of Jerusalem, regarding it as its capital in spite of the relevant United Nations resolutions and in particular Security Council resolutions 476, 478, 465, 271, 298, 267 and 252 adopted in various years and General Assembly resolution E35/169 of 15 December 1980, which determined that all legislative and administrative measures taken after the occupation of the city of Jerusalem were null and void and unlawful, and in which the General Assembly called upon all States, specialized agencies and other international organizations to disregard any measure contravening the provisions of that resolution.

You will notice that, in spite of the provisions of the above-mentioned resolution, Israel's credentials have been issued from occupied Jerusalem.

- (2) Israel has annexed the Syrian Arab Golan area and refused to implement the Security Council and General Assembly resolutions relating to the annulment of the annexation measures.
